### **Section 2: HISTORY AND CULTURE OF ARGENTINA**

3 in-service or 3 graduate credits – Buenos Aires

**Section 1 & 2:** 2/13/09 - 2/22/09 (Friday evening departure from JFK)

All sections require a pre-departure class at Dellecave. Date to be announced.

**Section 1:** Participants will experience the contrasting landscapes that constitute that Argentinean ecological system. They will explore the Southern Andes at Bariloche, ascending into the mountains on the border of Chile in what is designated by National Geographic as one of most spectacular landscapes in the world. They will discover the life style of the Patagonian gaucho at an active horse ranch once used by the legendary Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid. On the Brazil border they will explore world famous Iguazu Falls, the most panoramic water fall in the world at over 1.5 miles in width. Housed in a subtropical forest, this one-of-a-kind world heritage sight is the home for numerous unique varieties of animal life and vegetation.

**Section 2:** Through first hand visits to some of Argentina's most historically important locales, participants will gain a fuller knowledge of events in the nation's 500 year history. Following an orientation to the native and Spanish eras, participants will explore locales involved in Juan Peron and Evita Duarte's role in the nation's history, and the ensuing 20<sup>th</sup> century political and economic development. In Buenos Aires Boca section, they will explore the musical history of the tango as part of an intrinsic national movement. Participants will experience the contrasts of a transit system using 100 year old subway cars, and a modern airline fleet. They will learn about the mass migration of Europeans to Patagonia, the recent Falkland Islands War, and the economic stresses facing a middle class country with a 97% literacy rate and a 74 year life expectancy.

**(Sections 1 and 2)** \$2599 travel fee + taxes and airline fees (\$295 subject to change): per person double occupancy, roundtrip airfare, hotels, airport transfers and internal flights in Argentina, daily breakfasts, two dinners, first class bus coach service, tours and admission fees.

**Not included:** cost of Dellecave tuition.

**Additional Options:** Optional travel insurance \$129. Optional tips totaling about \$90.

Participants are responsible for roommate arrangements. Valid passports required, good until Sept. 2009. Reservations must be made in name exactly as it appears in passport. Extensive walking required. Argentina's facilities are not handicapped accessible.
